Immediate / Approaching Emergency


- EM and Public Safety will actively monitor the emergency
- Start preparing for the possibility of an evacuation
- Stand up EOC
- Coordinate necessary resources

Communication


- Start community notifications through CSUCI Alert
- Connect with UGCAM and Mission Hills offices

Evacuation Protocol

- · Notification of evacuation
- Request additional resources
- Controls for outbound traffic only
- Deploy evacuation teams into the community

Public Safety will coordinate with VC Fire to determine whether guided escorts are allowable.	Residents will be allowed to return home.
Wait for notification.	Public Safety will provide repopulation notification through CSUCI Alert.
Follow Public Safety instructions for guided escorts.	Contact Public Safety if assistance is needed.




